The Raritan River Project

The Lower Raritan Watershed's environmental health has strongly rebounded through EWA's advocacy over the past decade, but there is a long way to go. EWA's Raritan River Project pursues the cleanup and restoration of the hazardous waste sites posing the greatest threats to human health and environment.



Community Assistance Remediation Program (CARP)

A disproportionate number of contaminated sites are located in underprivileged urban communities. Since many urban areas lack proper recreational opportunities children routinely play on toxic sites, often ingesting hazardous material through dermal absorption or consumption. CARP provides scientific and technical assistance to disadvantaged citizens groups at these sites.

EWA INITIATIVES CONT'D

Dismal Swamp Conservation

At over 1,200 acres, the Dismal Swamp Conservation Area serves as the largest contiguous wetlands left in northern Middlesex County. EWA leads the preservation campaign for this environmentally sensitive area. EWA's Triple C Ranch, a 40-acre farm in Edison, is used for public recreation and environmental education. EWA also manages www.WildNewJersey.tv, the only daily wildlife news site.



Brownfields-to-Greenfields (B2G)

B2G restores abandoned industrial sites as safe open space for conservation, recreation and public access. With over 25,000 brownfields in New Jersey, the benefits of greenfields include improved community health, environmental justice, economic revitalization and restored ecosystems.
